Structure, Governance and Management

Governing Document

The Church is administered in accordance with the terms of the Church of Scotland Deed of Constitution (Unitary Form).

Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees

Members of the Kirk Session are the charity trustees. The Kirk Session members are the elders of the church and are chosen from those members of the church who are considered to have the appropriate gifts and skills. The Interim Moderator, who was appointed by Presbytery when the ministry post became vacant, is also a trustee.

Organisational Structure

The Kirk Session, which is chaired by the Interim Moderator or other person duly authorised by him, is responsible for all the affairs of the charity; it delegates certain responsibilities to its committees as appropriate. Currently there are two committees: Resourcing Committee and Congregational & Community Life Committee.

Objectives and Activities

The Church of Scotland is Trinitarian in doctrine, Reformed in tradition and Presbyterian in polity. It exists to glorify God and to work for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom throughout the world. As a national Church, it acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring the ordinances of religion to the people in every parish of Scotland through a territorial ministry. It co-operates with other Churches in various ecumenical bodies in Scotland and beyond.

Our church activities include regular worship, youth groups, community service and outreach groups, as well as support for charities. Youth organisations included Rangers, Guides, Brownies & Rainbows. Examples of activities are given in the following section on current year achievements and performance.

Katherine Taylor served as our Locum Minister till end September 2021 (A Locum is part-time and is responsible for worship and pastoral care.) We are grateful to Katherine for all the care, attention and encouragement she gave our congregation. In the last quarter of the year there was a rota for worship leaders and a rota for pastoral care cover provded by the three Leith CoS ministers.

Achievements and Performance

The church was again closed for worship from early in January 2021 till Palm Sunday due to coronavirus restrictions. Online worship services were provided, both pre-recorded and via Zoom joining with friends from Leith St Andrew's church. When the church reopened for worship, with attendances of 25-45 worshippers, an online version of the service continued to be provided. The ecumenical group of Leith churches held joint recorded reflections during Holy Week. The joint Leith Churches Forum bible study group met throughout the year via Zoom. After the lockdown at beginning of the year, the church building and grounds were opened again on Tuesday and Friday mornings and in the last quarter of the year on Friday mornings.

Again, due to Covid restrictions, we were not able to hold our usual congregational lunches after the communion services nor other social activities till we had a thanksgiving celebration at the end of September. We also resumed refreshments after the Sunday service in October till these stopped again in December due to the omicron strain of the virus. In our event at the end of September we took part in the CoS National Giving Day and we continued to encourage members to maintain their regular givings via the church magazines.

Members continued to provide witnessing and service in the community and beyond via the Edinburgh NE Foodbank and through the youth organisations, the Leith Churches Summer Holiday Club, donations for the Food Bank and Freshstart. Christmas gifts for local children and donations for Seafarers' Christmas bags were collected. Also this year again members supported a project to provide and deliver Christmas Hampers to New Scots families. Sadly the local primary school was not able to use the church for their Easter and Christmas assemblies and the uniformed youth organisations did not join in our Remembrance Sunday service.

The number of members at 31/12/21 is 123. There were no baptisms nor weddings during the year.

Provisional plans for The Leith Churches Forum vision for the Church of Scotland 'One Church for Leith' progressed with identification, and some development, of priorities for Mission. The Presbytery Mission Plan consultation document was received by Sessions in December 2021. Plans will be reviewed in 2022 as a result of this.

Financial Review

The total of members' offerings, the main source of revenue for the Church, at £37,972 is up slightly by £745 (2%) on the previous year. Additionally, £1,965 was given by members taking part in the National Giving Day. Gift Aid total tax recovery at £7,904 is down by 4% on last year. Income from use of premises of £1,105 is approximately the same as in 2020 as coronavirus restrictions contined to affect use of the hall. Grants of £1,575 were received from the government coronavirus jobs scheme. Investment dividends at £14,583 were down from last year's figure by £2,220, but continue to be a significant proportion of overall income. Extraordinary income consisting of a legacy of £5,000 and income of £25,000 from the BB company trustees (see note 3 to the accounts) was received. Total income for the year was £97,780; if the last two items of extraordinary income are discounted, total income is £67,780, approximately the same as in 2020.

Fabric expenditure of £9,207 was approximately the same as the previous year but again less than the budgeted figure. The biggest item of expenditure at £5,274 was for church roof and drains maintenance & repairs.

Total expenditure for the year was £79,240 compared to £89,003 in 2020. The difference is mainly accounted for by a reduction in the Ministries & Mission allocation. The surplus for the year is £18,540.

The value of investments held in Church of Scotland Investors Trust funds at the year end was £590,693 being up on the previous year end by £38,540. The total value of investments at year end was £597,198. Total funds at the end of the year are up on 2020 year end by £58,570 to £649,149.

Reserves Policy

It is the Trustees policy to hold reserves to fulfill our objectives of ensuring a Christian presence in North Leith, supporting the wider work of the Church and maintaining our Category A Listed building which is of significant local importance. With decreasing numbers in membership over the last number of years, leading to expenditure exceeding income, we have relied on the reserves, not just for the significant income generated, but also to meet the deficit. At the year end the Church held unrestricted funds of £648,797 as in Note 1.

The Church also held £352 of restricted funds which have been provided for the purposes specified in Note 1.

Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities

The members of the Kirk Session must prepare financial statements which give sufficient detail to enable an appreciation of the transactions of the Church during the financial year. The members of the Kirk Session are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which, on request, must reflect the financial position of the Church at that time. This must be done to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 and the Regulations Anent Congregational Finance approved by the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland in 2007. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Church and must take reasonable steps for the prevention and/or detection of fraud and other irregularities.

For the year under review the minimum stipend was £28,700 and the maximum stipend (in fifth and subsequent years) £35,269.
