#### Structure, Governance and Management

#### **Governing Document**

The Church is administered in accordance with the terms of the Church of Scotland Deed of Constitution (Unitary Form).

#### Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees

Members of the Kirk Session are the charity trustees. The Kirk Session members are the elders of the church and are chosen from those members of the church who are considered to have the appropriate gifts and skills. The Interim Moderator, who is appointed by Presbytery when the ministry post is vacant, is also a trustee.

#### Organisational Structure

The Kirk Session, which is chaired by the Interim Moderator or other person duly authorised by her, is responsible for all the affairs of the charity; it delegates certain responsibilities to its committees as appropriate. Currently there are two committees: Resourcing Committee and Congregational & Community Life Committee.

### Objectives and Activities

The Church of Scotland is Trinitarian in doctrine, Reformed in tradition and Presbyterian in polity. It exists to glorify God and to work for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom throughout the world. As a national Church, it acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring the ordinances of religion to the people in every parish of Scotland through a territorial ministry. It co-operates with other Churches in various ecumenical bodies in Scotland and beyond.

Our church activities include regular worship, community service and outreach, as well as support for charities. Youth organisations include Guides, Brownies & Rainbows, and maintenance of an interest in the Scouting groups that meet in the community. Examples of activities are given in the following section on current year achievements and performance.

#### Achievements and Performance

The church was open for worship throughout the year for the first time since the appearance of coronavirus in 2020. Recordings of services were also available on our website when possible. Church attendances were normally between 30 and 40 people except when we had joint services with South Leith and Newhaven members when the congregation numbered between 80 and 100 worshippers. The ecumenical group, Leith Churches Together, continued to hold monthly lunch-time services and a very well-supported and much appreciated, open service for the Leith Festival in June.

Opportunities for fellowship included after the Sunday services, at the LCT Lunchtime services, at a coffee morning and at the Bread & Cheese lunch held in May during Christian Aid Week. We were pleased to welcome girls and parents from the Guiding units back to our Remembrance Sunday service with girls taking part in the service. The girls also helped with the Christmas parcels for our housebound/elderly members. Trinity Primary School was in contact in the Christmas period but after consideration decided to have their Christmas Assembly nearer the school in Trinity Academy. We look forward to seeing them in the church again in 2023.

Members continued to provide witnessing and service in the community and beyond via the Edinburgh NE Foodbank, and through the youth organisations, the Leith Churches Summer Holiday Club, donations for the Food Bank and Freshstart. The church and grounds continued to be open to all on Friday mornings. Christmas gifts for local children and donations for Seafarers' Christmas bags were collected. Again this year members supported a project to provide and deliver Christmas Hampers to New Scots families. Warm clothes were also collected for crew and refugees on the ship in Leith docks housing refugees from Ukraine. Our Christmas Appeal is going to the British Red Cross Afghanistan Crisis Appeal.

The number of members on the roll at 31/12/22 is 121. There was one child baptism during the year.

The first consultation document on the new Presbytery Mission Plan proposed that Newhaven, North Leith and South Leith churches should work together towards a union for a new parish encompassing the current three separate parishes. Despite some disappointment that the four churches in Leith Churches Forum, who had been working together for many years and most recently with plans for One Church for Leith, had been split up, the Kirk Session agreed to work within the new grouping. In January a joint meeting of the three Kirk Sessions was held resulting in agreement to forming a new Steering Group, Towards Our New Parish. The steering group has met monthly since then and joint congregational worship services have been held monthly.

#### Financial Review

This is primarily due to loss of members of the worshipping congregation over 2021-22, whether by death, declining health or moving away. Gift Aid total tax recovery at £7,545 is down on last year (£7,904). Income from use of premises of £3,810 is up on 2021 as coronavirus restrictions relaxed allowing more use of the hall. Investment dividends at £14,393 are approximately the same as last year's figure (£14,583), and continue to be a significant proportion of overall income. Extraordinary income received consisted of £75,000 being the final payment from the BB company trustees (see note 3 to the accounts) and £830 from disbursement of the former Leith Churches Forum funds. In addition we called down £11,233, covering relevant insurance costs, from our Consolidated Fabric Fund revenue account. Total income for the year was £145,483; if the last three items of extraordinary income are discounted, total income is £58,420 compared to the equivalent 2021 figure of £66,205, which as well as higher offerings also included more income from irregular donations.

Fabric expenditure amounted to £8,502, slightly less than the previous year as again only necessary work was undertaken. The biggest items of expenditure were £2,880 for a replacement control unit for the church heating system, and £1,660 for church roof and drains maintenance & repairs. There were no Locum costs this year as we have not had a Locum Minister for all of 2022. Total expenditure for the year was £76,366 compared to £79,240 in 2021. The surplus for the year is £69,117. Without the extraordinary income listed above this would have been a deficit of nearly £18,000.

The value of investments held at the year end is £527,460 being down on the previous year end by £69,738. Total funds at the end of the year are approximately the same as at the end of 2021 at £648,528 (2021, £649,149), the surplus of receipts over payments for the year roughly balancing out the drop in investment values.

#### Reserves Policy

It is the Trustees policy to hold reserves to fulfill our objectives of ensuring a Christian presence in North Leith, supporting the wider work of the Church and maintaining our Category A Listed building which is of significant local importance. With decreasing numbers in membership over the last number of years, leading normally to expenditure exceeding income, we have relied on the reserves, not just for the significant income generated, but also to meet the deficit. At the year end the Church held unrestricted funds of £648,528 as in Note 1.

The Church now has no remaining restricted funds.

Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities

The members of the Kirk Session must prepare financial statements which give sufficient detail to enable an appreciation of the transactions of the Church during the financial year. The members of the Kirk Session are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which, on request, must reflect the financial position of the Church at that time. This must be done to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 and the Regulations Anent Congregational Finance approved by the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland in 2007. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Church and must take reasonable steps for the prevention and/or detection of fraud and other irregularities.

#### 5. Trustee Remuneration and Related Party Transactions

During the year two trustees (the interim moderator at 31 Dec 2021 and the interim moderator at 31 Dec 2022) received reimbursement of expenses incurred for travel totalling £502. In addition the church office secretary who is a member of the Kirk Session received remuneration of £3063.

No trustee or a person related to a trustee had any personal interest in any contract or transaction entered into by the charity during the year.

#### 6. Minister's Stipend

All Church of Scotland congregations contribute to the National Stipend Fund which bears the costs of all ministers' stipends and employer's contributions for national insurance, pension and housing and loan fund. Ministers' stipends are paid in accordance with the national stipend scale which is related to years of service. For the year under review the minimum stipend was £28,700 and the maximum stipend (in fifth and subsequent years) £35,269.

# Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of North Leith Parish Church Scottish Charity No SC 004932

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2022 which are set out on pages 6 to 10.

# Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

## Basis of independent examiner's statement
